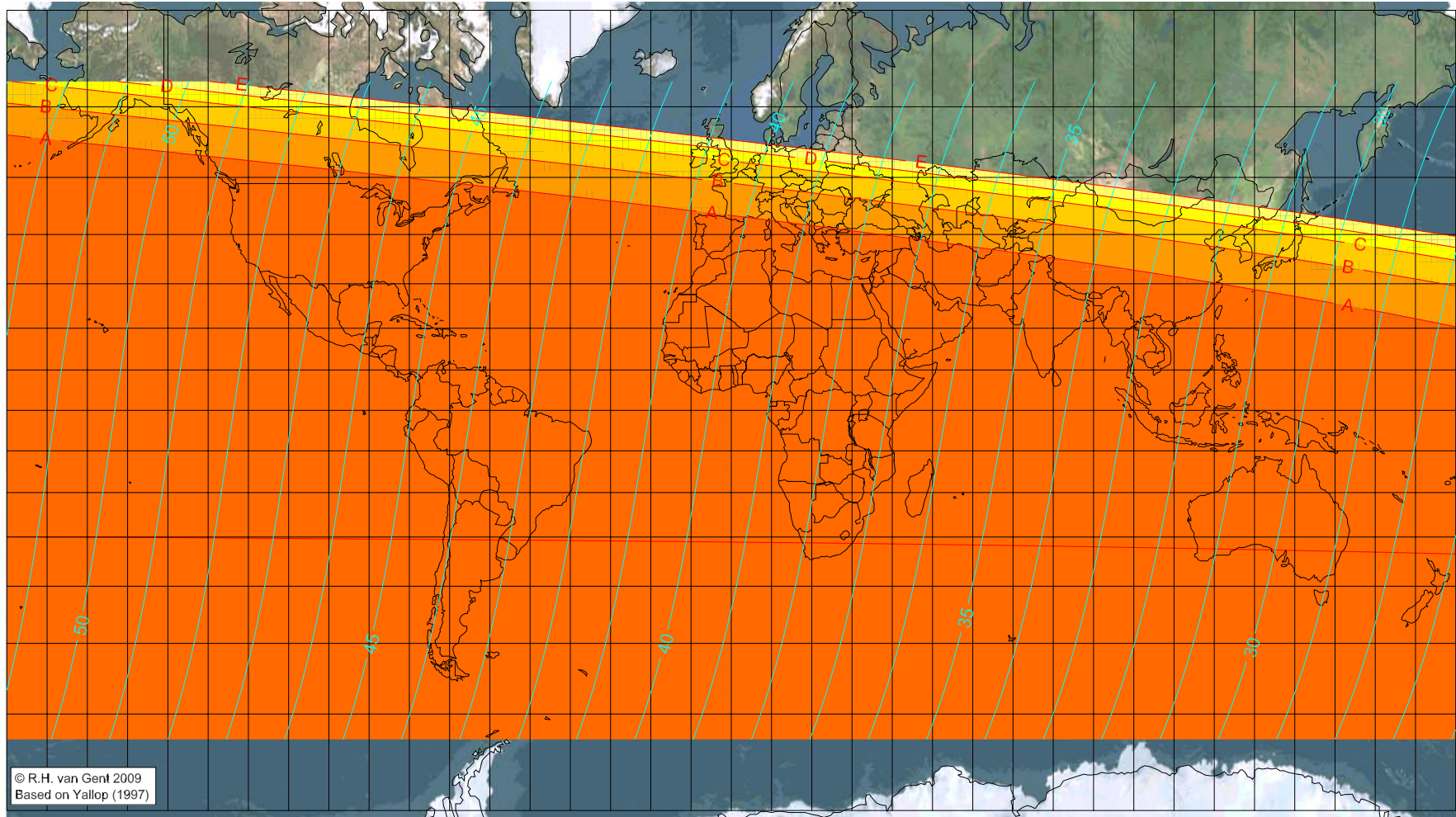


First visibility lunar crescent for Ramaḍān 1431 AH
