


First visibility lunar crescent for Jumādā 'l-Ākhira 1434 AH

Astronomical New Moon: 10 April 2013, 9h 35.3m (UTC)

- █ A – easily visible to the unaided eye
- █ B – visible under perfect atmospheric conditions
- █ C – visible to the unaided eye after found with optical aid
- █ D – only visible with binoculars or conventional telescopes
- █ E – not visible with conventional telescopes
- █ F – below Danjon limit (7°)
- moonset before sunset
- before conjunction (astronomical new moon)
